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WHY A HEADACHE CLINIC?

It is generally recognised that migraine is a public health problem in terms its burden on the individual, society and the economy.

It had been estimated that the prevalence of migraine is approximately 6% among men and 15-17% among women and is variable by age, decreasing in both men and women after the age of 40.

In a study of employees of one NHS Trust hospital, it was estimated that migraine-related absence from work and reduced effectiveness whilst at work cost the Trust between £50,000 and £63,000 per annum.

It therefore makes sense that both the employer and the employee are aware of the various ways of treating headache and migraine, and, perhaps more importantly, know how to prevent headache attacks.

This half-day clinic is designed to do address these issues.

WHICH INDIVIDUALS WILL BENEFIT?

The Headache Clinic will be of use to anyone who suffers from headache/migraine or is employed in an occupational health capacity and wants up-to-date information about ways to treat and manage the condition.

TOPICS TO BE COVERED

A variety of topics and issues relating to the causes and management of headaches will be covered. Some of these topics are listed below:

- **The nature of headaches:** General considerations about the nature, incidence and diagnosis of head pain in child and adult populations. The economic consequences of headache and migraine will also be covered.
- **Types of headache:** Migraine and migraine variants, eyestrain headache, premenstrual headache, exertion headache, tension headache and hypertensive headache.
- **Causes of headache:** Including the proposed role of family history, changes in blood flow and brain chemistry, tension and emotional states and the influence of diet.
- **Treatment of headache:** Treatments available for the various types of headache. In addition to methods of pharmacological management, the role of massage and relaxation techniques will be discussed.
- **Prevention of headache:** A consideration of medications thought to decrease frequency of attacks, plus an evaluation of elimination diets and complementary therapies.
